Course Description

The Facts 202 is an advanced, clinically oriented training that builds upon the foundation of HIV Prevention Counseling: The Facts. This course covers an in-depth array of different clinical topics, including the basic science of HIV, medications, co-infections and opportunistic infections, lab values, and nutrition. Learners will come away with increased knowledge in these critical areas of HIV treatment and management.

Course Objectives

After participating in this training, learners will be able to:

1. Explain the structure of the HIV virus and describe its subtypes;
2. State the goals and rationale behind ARV therapy;
3. List signs and symptoms and appropriate prophylaxis of common OIs;
4. Interpret lab values and explain the basic causes of resistance; and
5. Discuss the role of nutrition assessment and management in HIV/AIDS care.

Target Audience

This training is intended for physicians, nurses, advanced practice nurses, physician's assistants, pharmacists, social workers, substance abuse professionals, case managers, and all others providing clinical care for HIV infected individuals. Successful completion of The Facts 101 is a pre-requisite for participation.
